Love the boot

From the Piney Hills of North Louisiana to the marshes of the Atchafalaya Basin, Louisiana is home to a wide range of animals and habitats. This program allows students to discover and see Louisiana native animals first-hand.

A world of differences

Students will encounter animals from different continents and classes, including reptiles, birds and mammals.

Secrets that keep them safe

Many small animals have behavioral and physical adaptations not immediately visible to the naked eye that help keep them safe when confronted by a predator.

South of the border
